## IGSK KHAITAN ORGANISES HEALTHY CAFETERIA DAY

“Healthy Cafeteria Day “was organized at The Indian Community School Kuwait, Khaitan Branch by the students of Class 7 as a part of the SIF – Project – “Project Healthy Schools.” It was conducted under the guidance of the Science teachers Mrs. Jaya Nirmal and Mrs. Sheela Binu to drive home the fact that school cafeterias offer great potential to improve students’ eating habits.

Obesity and Overweight have become a global epidemic and childhood obesity represents a serious health problem because it tends to continue into adulthood. Promoting and establishing healthy habits in students is probably more effective and fruitful than trying to change unhealthy habits later in life. Given the influence the environment can exert on students’ food choice, it is crucial to create a healthy food environment in schools that facilitates students to choose healthy food products.

As a part of the Healthy Cafeteria Day, students from classes 6th to 9th brought home made healthy breakfasts which included a wide variety of items made of dairy, whole grains, whole pulses, vegetables and ethnic dishes. The response was overwhelming and the team observed that children showed more inclination towards choosing the home made breakfasts when compared to the usual bread, cheese and butter that they have every morning.

To support the initiative which was well appreciated, the Principal ordered changes to be made to the school cafeteria by removing junk foods such as chips and aerated drinks from their shelves, as these are high in refined sugars with high calorific values and are major contributing factors of obesity. Having taken the first step in the right direction we hope that the young minds will benefit greatly in their food habits and healthy all round growth and development.

# Indian embassy celebrates Republic Day



Indian Embassy in Kuwait yesterday celebrated Republic Day, one of the most significant days on the calendar. Hundreds of Indian nationals including women joined Indian Ambassador Sunil Jain and embassy officials to celebrate the occasion in an atmosphere of joy and festivity. The embassy put on a festive look with its entrance decorated with tri-color balloons.

An open-air ceremony held on the embassy premises, where the national flag was hoisted at 9 am commemorating the 65th anniversary of the moment when the constitution of India came into effect in 1950. Top diplomats, embassy officials, Indian consular officers and media attended the flag-hoisting ceremony, which was followed by the singing of national anthem. Following the flag-hoisting ceremony, Ambassador Jain read out Indian President Pranab Mukherjee's address to the nation.

He also took a stock of the achievements of the Indian

community over the last one year," noted the ambassador in his brief address. He said the strength of the community is steadily growing in Kuwait with the number touching 950,000-mark today. Referring to the government's proposal to reduce the number of expatriate population in the country as part of the demographic balancing, he said, "I have received assurances from the higher authorities that our community will not be harmed in any circumstances." He expressed his gratitude to His Highness the Amir, His Highness the Crown Prince and His Highness the Premier and the people of Kuwait for the continuous support and encouragement to the community.

"However, this comes with a responsibility. As a law-abiding community, we have to always respect the law of the land and obey the rules," he reminded.

Regarding the rising incidents of crimes in Abbasiya and Jleeb areas, the ambassador cautioned the people to take precautions. "The officials in the ministry of interior and Farwaniya governorate have given assurances to us that they will take necessary measures

to curb such incidents in the area," he said. "According to official estimates, approximately 10,000 Indians are in Kuwait without valid documents or residence permits. The embassy is in discussion with the authorities regarding the repatriation of these people to India," he said.

The ambassador said his tenure as the ambassador to Kuwait has been extended for one more year. "The facilities in the embassy have improved over the years. However, he admitted that there is still room for improvement. He said the embassy has issued up to 6,000 entry permits last year. The non-resident Indians can change their status of Rs 500 and Rs 1000 in India until June 30, 2017. The details of demonetization of the Indian banknotes by the government were informed. Students from Indian schools - Al-Farooq School (Amman, Junior and Khaitan branches), Al-Farooq School and FAIPS — sang patriotic songs of the occasion. Newspapers in Kuwait, including Kuwait Times and Al-Naba, provided supplements to mark the day.

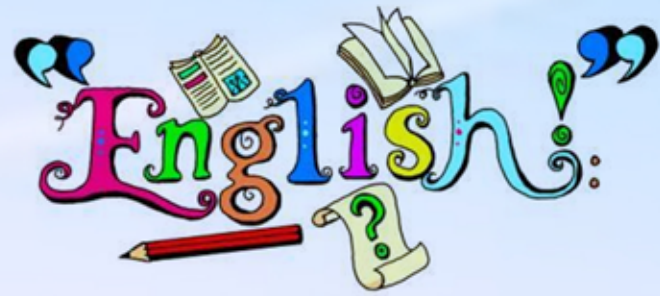
